**VOICES FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES**

Put children front and center for the 2018 midterm elections by co-hosting a non-partisan gubernatorial forum with 600 members of the community joining us.

**CHILDREN IN IMMIGRANT FAMILIES**

Released original research with immigrant families, health providers, and community leaders to guide how California can help mitigate the increased fear and anxiety in immigrant communities and better support the mental health and well-being of children.

**AB 2315**

**ADVANCED EFFORTS TO USE TECHNOLOGY TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO HEALTH SERVICES FOR CHILDREN**

Passed AB 2315 to help develop guidelines for the use of telehealth for mental and behavioral health services in public schools and released a report to help communities adopt telehealth in school and child care settings.

Launched **Let's Talk: Bright Futures for Migrant Children**, with the California Department of Education's Migrant Education Program, to support the oral health and nutrition of the nation's largest migrant student population.

Created **ALL IN For Safe Schools**, a new partnership with the California Department of Education to support the creation of a safe and welcoming school environment for every child in every school district.

Supported a **whole-child approach**, challenging our child- and youth-serving systems to consider child well-being as the shared priority and convening 40 local, state, and national child welfare, juvenile justice, and behavioral health leaders to develop a policy roadmap to ensure all youth are safe, healthy, and thriving.
